THESIS CHECKLIST

Scope: Defining your Object of Study

✓ Is your scope text-based and appropriately focused for the assignment?

Have you clearly articulated the specific object that you're examining?

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- Is that object text-based?
- Is that object sufficiently focused?

Method: Articulating your Method of Analysis (Your method for engaging the text)

- ✓ How have you gone about analyzing the object of your text?
 Did you dissect and examine its various components and how they work as a whole? (archaeological dig)

 - Did you identify and examine the various instances in which this object occurs throughout the larger text in order to deduce a trajectory and/or any patterns for how this object is employed in the text? (follow the trail)
- Do you provide clear, relevant, and accurately-cited textual evidence of the object you're examining? Do you carefully and thoroughly explain what you observe about that object and how you're observing?

Claim: Positing a claim, based on your analysis, about how the text works and why that how matters

- Do you posit an interpretive claim about the object based on your careful and thorough analysis?
 Is the claim about that object (or is it about an idea or aspect of the text that is actually elsewhere and outside this object)?
- Do you articulate the stakes of your claim? Do you posit in your interpretation how your claim about this object affects the way we understand (think about) some larger part of the text (a theme, a character, an overarching question)?

Roadmap: Organizational Preview (2-4 sentences)

- Do you follow the statement of your claim with a roadmap that allows your reader to preview how you will illustrate the claim in the paper?
- Does your roadmap reflect and/or complement your method of analysis?
